

## TITLE I POLICY AND ADMINISTRATION

ARTICLE X  
CITY MARSHALL

1-10.1 APPOINTMENT. The mayor shall appoint at the first regular meeting in January of each even numbered year, a Marshall who shall hold his office at the pleasure of the Mayor. The Mayor may in cases of emergency, appoint such number of special policemen as he may think proper, reporting such appointments to the Council at their next regular meeting, but no such special policemen shall serve longer than until the next regular meeting of the City Council, after his appointment.

1-10.2 AUTHORITY. The City Marshall is authorized to perform every act permitted to be performed by a peace officer by Iowa Law subject to the following guidelines and limitations.

1-10.3 DUTIES. The City Marshall shall investigate complaints of violations of city ordinances. Reports of these investigations shall be made to the Council and to the City Attorney or attorney specially employed by the Council if any, employed to represent the City in criminal prosecutions for violations of city ordinances.

1-10.4 VIOLATION CITY ORDINANCES. Violations of city ordinances shall be prosecuted only upon complaints prepared and filed on behalf of the City by the City Attorney or attorney specially employed by the City Council to represent the City in criminal prosecutions for violation of City ordinances, as may be permitted by Iowa Law.

1-10.5 VIOLATION STATE AND COUNTY LAWS. Complaints and crimes under the Iowa Code or the ordinances of Henry County and any investigation reports of such offenses shall be forwarded to both Henry County Sheriff and Henry County Attorney for further investigation and prosecution as permitted by the Code of Iowa.

1-10.6 COMPENSATION. The City Marshall shall be compensated at the rate of \$175.00 per month for his services.

1-10.7 The Mayor and the Mayor-Pro-Tem, and the Clerk/Treasurer shall have the authority to do all administrative duties that are required to be performed by the City Marshall in the City Code of Salem, Iowa.

In addition, the City Council, by resolution, may authorize other individuals to perform such administrative duties.
