**ARTICLE 1
STREET REGULATIONS****4 – 1.1 REMOVAL OF WARNING DEVICES.**

It shall be unlawful for a person to willfully remove, thrown down, destroy or carry away from any highway, street, alley, avenue or bridge any lamp, obstructions, guard or other article or things, or extinguish any lamp or other light, erected or places thereupon for the purpose of guarding or enclosing unsafe or dangerous places in said highway, street, alley, avenue or bridge without the consent of the person in control thereof.

4 – 1.2 OBSTRUCTING OR DEFACING STREETS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to obstruct, deface, or injure any public road in any manner.

4 – 1.3 PLACING DEBRIS ON STREETS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to throw or deposit on any street/ or alley any glass bottle, glass, nails, tacks, wire, cans, trash, garbage, rubbish, litter, offal, or any other debris, or any other substance likely to injure any person, animal or vehicle.

4 – 1.4 INJURING NEW PAVEMENT.

It shall be unlawful for any person to willfully injure new pavement in any street, alley or sidewalk by willfully driving, walking or making marks on such pavement before it is ready for use.

4 – 1.5 PLAYING IN STREETS.

It shall be unlawful for any person to coast, sled or play games on streets or highways except in the areas blocked off by the council for such purposes.

4 – 1.6 TRAVELING ON BARRICADED STREET PROHIBITED.

It shall be unlawful for any person to travel or operate any vehicle on any street or public way temporarily closed by barricades, lights, signs, or flares placed thereon by the authority or permission of any city official, police officer or member of the fire department.

4 – 1.7 BURNING PROHIBITED.

No person shall burn any trash, leaves, rubbish or other combustible material in any curb or gutter or on any paved or surfaced street.

4 – 1.8 CULVERTS.

If a culvert is deemed necessary under any driveway or any other access to a property owner's property, the property owner shall first obtain permission from the city council for the installation of such a culvert. The City shall have a right to specify the size and type of culvert to be installed. The property owner shall pay for the culvert and the City shall install the same. After installation, the property owner shall maintain said culvert and keep it free from accumulated debris and fill. In the event repairs are needed at any time with respect to a culvert, it shall be the duty of the property owner to make such repairs, and in the event he fails to do so, the City shall have a right to make the repairs, then the City may assess the costs against the property for collection in the same manner as property tax as provided by law.

****AMENDMENT:****4 – 1.9 ONE-WAY STREETS.**

Upon a roadway designated and signposted for one-way traffic a vehicle shall be driven only in the direction designated.

The following are recognized as one-way streets, in the City of Salem, IA:

1. E. School Street: One-Way travelling West; beginning at the intersection of E. School St. & Salem Rd/E. Jackson St. and ending at the intersection of E. School St. & S. Lincoln St.

SEVERABILITY CLAUSE. If any section, provision or part of this Ordinance shall be adjudged invalid or unconstitutional, such adjudication shall not affect the validity of the Ordinance as a whole or any section, provision or part thereof not adjudged invalid or unconstitutional.

EFFECTIVE DATE. This Ordinance shall be in effect after its final passage, approval and publication as provided by law.
