

TITLE II - COMMUNITY PROTECTION

ARTICLE III PRIVATE PROPERTY

2-3.1 TRESPASSING PROHIBITED. It shall be unlawful for a person to commit one or more of the following acts:

1. Enter Property Without Permission. Enter upon or in private property without legal justification or without the implied or actual permission of the owner, leasee, or person in lawful possession with the intent to commit a public offence or to use, remove therefrom, alter, damage, harass, or place thereon or therein anything animate or inanimate, without the implied or actual permission of the owner, leasee, or person in lawful possession.

2. Vacate Property When Requested. Enter or remain upon or in private property without legal justification after being notified or requested to abstain from entering or to remove or vacate therefrom by the owner, leasee or person in lawful possession or by any peace officer, magistrate, or public employee whose duty it is to supervise the use or maintenance of the property.

3. Interfere With Lawful Use of Property. Enter upon or in private property for the purpose or with the effect of unduly interfering with the lawful of the property by others.

4. Use of Property Without Permission. Be upon or in private property and use, remove therefrom, alter, damage, harass, or place thereon or therein anything animate or inanimate, without the implied or actual permission of the owner, leasee, or person in lawful possessor
